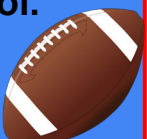

I wanted to follow up on the email I sent yesterday regarding our 2023 accountability rating and provide some additional context.

Bailey Middle School received an overall "B" rating. While we are proud of the work reflected in that rating, it's important to note that it is based on STAAR assessment results from nearly two years ago following significant changes to the state's evaluation system and ongoing legal challenges that have affected how schools across Texas are assessed.

To provide further perspective, Austin ISD as a whole shifted from a "B" district in 2019 to a "C" in 2023. Across the district, 30 schools were identified as "F"-rated—16 of which had previously been rated "B." This trend is not isolated to Austin; across Texas, the number of schools rated "F" increased by 233%.

Although Bailey maintained a "B" rating, I want to ensure our community understands the broader context, especially as these ratings may be highlighted in the media in the coming days. Please know that regardless of any label or rating, my commitment remains the same: to make Bailey a safe, supportive, and academically rigorous school for **all** of our students.
